5. Examine **either** morality **or** boundaries in relation to **one** of the following:
 - systems of stratification
 - cosmology
 - ritual and religion
 - socialization/enculturation/acclturation (choose **one**).

6. To what extent can changes in communication technologies affect **either** social relations **or** identity?
7. Discuss the role of **either** communication **or** globalization in relation to **one** of the following:
 - political discourse
 - media and popular culture
 - commodification
 - performance.

8. Compare and contrast **either** power **or** identity in relation to resistance in **two** societies you have studied.
9. Discuss the role of **either** conflict **or** consensus in relation to **one** of the following:
